EXECUTIVE SUMMARY





- International Linkages. There were 17 functional international linkages forged by the University. These linkages were in the areas of academic exchange of students and faculty, faculty scholarship grant, basic and higher education, research, distance education, technical assistance, among others.
- Program Accreditation. The University had a total of 27 academic programs re-accredited to Level III status: 14 graduate programs and 13 undergraduate programs during the school year.
- Accreditation Award. DMMMSU was awarded in February 2015 by the Accredeting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities (AACCUP), Philppines, Inc. as the Number 1 SUC in the country with the most number of programs awarded Level III Re-accredited Status.
- Student Enrolment. There were 18,449 students enrolled during the first semester, which is 12.50 % increase from last year's same semester enrolment of 16,796. In the second semester, there is a 6.67 % increase, 16,833 against last year's 15,785. More than half of the total enrolment (50.76%) during the first semester was registered by the Mid La Union Campus; and 49.34% during the second semester.
- **Graduates.** A total of 3,162 students from basic education to doctorate programs graduated during the school year. More than three-fourths (2,382 or 75.33%) were graduates from various baccalaureate programs. The University turned in a total of 80 honor graduates: 68 *cum laude* and 12 *magna cum laude*.

- Licensure Exams. Higher passing rates in the following board examinations compared to the national passing rates were recorded by the University: Licensure Exam for Teachers - Elementary, Electrical Engineer Licensure Exam, Mechanical Engineer Licensure Exam and Midwifery.
- Faculty Profile. Almost half (49%) of the 570 Faculty of the University held professorial academic ranks. Majority (73%) are very highly educationally qualified: almost half (49%) were Master's degree holders while almost one-fourth (24%) were doctorate degree holders. Most Faculty members come from MLUC (39%), followed by SLUC (34%) and NLUC (25%), Table 6.
- Faculty and Staff Development. There were 4 faculty and staff who pursued doctorate degrees, and 11 who pursued masters in various institutions.
- International Awards. Two staff of the University won international awards while a good number reaped local distinctions. A significant number of faculty and staff of the University attended, either as participants or presenters, seminars/trainings/conferences, held in international venues.
- Students Awards. DMMMSU students shone and won awards in various regional, national and international competitions. Several students reaped accolades in international research tilts.
- International Research Publication. Eight university researches were published in international scientific research journals. Twenty-three papers on University researches and best practices were presented in international conferences and fora.
- **Extension Services.** There were more than 8,000 clients from all parts of the country who were beneficiaries of extension activities of the University. These activities ranged from technical assistance, trainings, community outreach, lecture demonstrations, tree planting, environmental protection to training needs assessment.
- Net Income Generated. The University generated a total of P5,802,969.32 net income from its various income-generating projects. Top earners were the fastfood of North La Union Campus; facilities rentals of Mid La Union Campus; space rentals/stalls and canteen of South La Union Campus and the Technology Fee and Call Center and Medical Transcription of the Open University System.
- **Infrastructure Development.** There were 63 infrastructure projects, worth P77,966,084.89, that were completed. Funding of these projects was sourced out from various donors, e.g. national and local leaders, alumni, private firms, and the Commission on Higher Education.
- Outsourced Resources. The University outsourced from various benevolent patrons, benefactors and worth of equipment and material. Among the donors were the donors a total of P2,332,314.80 NSDevil Co., Ltd., S.K., Korean International Cooperation Agency, Commission on Higher Education, Department of Agriculture-Regional Field Unit 1, NGOs and Alumni.
- Climate Change Mitigation. A good number of mitigation activities were conducted by the University to address climate change. Massive clean-up (roadside, coastal, river), tree planting, environmental education, rainwater harvesting, solid waste management trainings, among others, were conducted.
- International Trainings Conducted. With funding support from The Bridge, Dhaka, Bangladesh and GCG, Bangladesh, two international trainings, study tours/visits for 12 Bangladeshi nationals were organized, coordinated and conducted by the University.
